

Federal-Local Law Enforcement Collaboration in Investigating and Prosecuting Urban Crime, 1982–1999: Drugs, Weapons, and Gangs

In October, 1982, President Reagan announced the establishment of a National Center for State and Local Law Enforcement Training at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC). A branch of the Department of Treasury with three locations in Glynco (Glencoe), Georgia, **Marana**, Arizona, and Artesia, New Mexico, FLETC housed training staffs of nearly 20 Federal law enforcement agencies (including the DEA) and was already charged with providing training for most Federal law enforcement agents. Now, largely on a tuition-free basis, it was tasked with offering specialized training to state and local law enforcement in sophisticated investigative techniques and intelligence analysis, particularly in the areas of violence and drug-related activity, as well as organized crime.

Within a few years, FLETC was training nearly 4,000 state and local officers each year, while DEA training (which later moved to the FBI's Quantico, Virginia training site in 1985) involved twice that number. ([Here](#))

Public Law 100-440 102 STAT. 1721

100th Congress

An Act

Making appropriations for the Treasury Department, the United States Postal and certain Independent Agencies, for the fiscal year ending September 30,1989, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the following sums are appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the Treasury Department, the United States Postal Service, the Executive Office of the President, and certain Independent Agencies, for the fiscal year ending September 30,1989, and for other purposes, namely:

OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY

For necessary expenses of the Office of the Secretary, including operation and maintenance of the Treasury Building and Annex; hire of passenger motor vehicles; not to exceed \$22,000 for official reception and representation expenses; not to exceed \$200,000 for unforeseen emergencies of a confidential nature, to be allocated and expended under the direction of the Secretary of the Treasury and to be accounted for solely on his certificate; not to exceed \$573,000, to remain available until expended, for repairs and improvements to the Main Treasury Building and Annex; \$59,618,000.

For necessary expenses of the international affairs function of the Office of the Secretary; hire of passenger motor vehicles; maintenance, repairs, and improvements of, and purchase of commercial insurance policies for, real properties leased or owned overseas, when necessary for the performance of official business; not to exceed \$2,000,000 for official travel expenses; and not to exceed \$73,000 for official reception and representation expenses; \$22,000,000

FEDERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING CENTER

Treasury Department Appropriations Act, 1989.

For necessary expenses of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center, as a bureau of the Department of the Treasury, including purchase (not to exceed fifteen for police-type use) and hire of passenger motor vehicles; for expenses for student athletic and related activities; uniforms without regard to the general purchase price limitation for the current fiscal year; the conducting of and participating in firearms matches and presentation of awards; for public awareness and enhancing community support of law enforcement training; not to exceed \$5,000 for official reception and representation expenses; room and board for student interns; and services as authorized by 5 U.S.C. 3109: **Provided**, That the Center is authorized the acceptance of gifts: **Provided further**, That funds appropriated in this account shall be available for State and local government law enforcement training on a space-available basis; training of foreign law enforcement officials on a space-available basis with reimbursement of actual costs to this appropriation; training of private sector security officials on a space-available basis with reimbursement of actual costs to this appropriation; travel expenses of non-Federal personnel to attend State and local course development meetings at the Center: **Provided further**, That the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center shall hire up to and maintain an average of not less than 425 direct full-time equivalent positions for fiscal year 1989; \$34,664,000: **Provided further**, That none of the funds appropriated under this heading shall be used to reduce the level of advanced training or other training activities of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center at **Marana**, Arizona. For acquisition, construction, improvements, and related expenses (to include design, equipment, furnishings, and other such costs) for the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center, \$20,000,000 to remain available until expended: **Provided**, That of this amount, \$7,000,000 shall remain available for the acquisition, renovation, and adaptation of the former Artesia Christian College campus in Artesia, New Mexico, as a facility of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center: **Provided further**, That \$13,000,000 shall be available for the first phase of implementation of the Master Plan for the expansion of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center at GIpco (?), Georgia, and for on-going maintenance, facility improvements, and related equipment: **Provided further**, That the Master Plan for the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center shall make provision for construction of an advanced firearms training range for participating agencies with specialized firearms training requirements.

OFFICE OF INSPECTOR GENERAL SALARIES AND EXPENSES

For necessary expenses of the Office of Inspector General in carrying out the provisions of the Inspector General Act of 1978, as amended, hire of passenger motor vehicles; not to exceed \$1,543,000 to remain available until expended, for systems modernization requirements; \$21,296,000. **FINANCIAL CRIMES ENFORCEMENT NETWORK SALARIES AND EXPENSES**

For necessary expenses of the Financial Crimes Enforcement Network, including hire of passenger motor vehicles; and not to exceed \$3,000 for official reception and representation expenses; \$16,488,000. **FEDERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING**

CENTER SALARIES AND EXPENSES

For necessary expenses of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center, as a bureau of the Department of the Treasury, including purchase (not to exceed thirty for police-t3rpe use) and hire of passenger motor vehicles; for expenses for student athletic and related activities; uniforms without regard to the general purchase price limitation for the current fiscal year; the conducting of and participating in firearms matches and presentation of awards; for public awareness and enhancing community support of law enforcement training; not to exceed \$7,000 for official reception and representation expenses; room and board for student interns; and services as authorized by 5 U.S.C. 3109: Provided, That the Center is authorized to accept gifts: Provided further, That notwithstanding any other provision of law, students attending training at any Federal Law Enforcement Training Center site shall reside in on- Center or Center-provided housing, insofar as available and in accordance with Center policy: Provided further. That funds appropriated in this account shall be available for State and local government law enforcement training on a space-available basis; training of foreign law enforcement officials on a space-available basis with reimbursement of actual costs to this appropriation; training of private sector security officials on a space available basis with reimbursement of actual costs to this appropriation; travel expenses of non-Federal personnel to attend State £md local course development meetings at the Center: Provided further, That the Director of Federal Law Enforcement Training Center shall annually present an award to be accompanied by a gift of intrinsic value to the outstanding student who graduated from a basic training program at the Center during the previous fiscal year, to be funded by donations received through the Center's gift authority: Provided further. That none of the funds appropriated under this heading shall be used to reduce the level of advanced training or other training activities of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center at **Marana**, Arizona; \$40,265,000: Provided further, That the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center shall hire up to and maintain an average of not less than 441 direct full-time equivalent positions for fiscal year 1991.

For expansion of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center, for acquisition of necessary additional real property and facilities, and for ongoing maintenance, facility improvements, and related expenses, \$20,775,000, to remain available until expended.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT SERVICE

For necessary expenses of the Financial Management Service, \$218,742,000, of which not to exceed \$13,287,000 shall remain available until expended for systems modernization initiatives.
